Dear Lancaster General Health employee:

Lancaster General Health offers a Retirement Income Account that provides a generous employer basic contribution, a matching contribution, outstanding convenience, and a variety of investment options. Take a look and see what a difference the Plan could make in achieving your retirement goals.

If you have not enrolled in the Lancaster General Health Retirement Income Account within 45 days of your eligibility date, you will be automatically enrolled in the Lancaster General Health Retirement Income Account at a contribution rate of 6% of your pretax eligible earnings. Based on your date of birth and assuming a retirement age of 65, you will be invested in a Fidelity Freedom® Fund, with a corresponding target retirement date. You will also be enrolled in an Automatic Increase Program, which will increase your contribution rate by 1% annually. We encourage you to take an active role in the Lancaster General Health Retirement Income Account and choose a contribution rate and investment options that are appropriate to you. If you do not wish to contribute to the Lancaster General Health Retirement Income Account, you must change your contribution rate to 0% within the first 45 calendar days of your eligibility.

Benefit from:

Basic contributions (Employer Non-Matching Contributions). Lancaster General Health will make a non-matching contribution in the amount of 2% of compensation for all eligible employees, regardless of employee contributions.*

*This is an annual discretionary employer contribution for Affilia Home Health employees.

Matching contributions. Lancaster General Health also helps your contributions grow through a generous employer match of 50% up to 6% of all compensation you contribute to the Plan each pay period during the calendar year--it's like getting "free" money. That's why it makes good financial sense to take advantage of this great benefit today!

Online beneficiary. With Fidelity's Online Beneficiaries Service, you can designate your beneficiaries, receive instant online confirmation, and check your beneficiary information virtually any time.

Tax savings now. Pretax contributions are deducted from your pay before income taxes are deducted. This means that you can actually lower the amount of current income taxes you pay each period. It could mean more money in your take-home pay versus saving money in a taxable account.

Tax savings later. Roth contributions are after-tax deductions from your pay. This means you pay taxes now on the contributions you make--but later your earnings are all tax free if you make a qualified withdrawal. Look for details on what constitutes a qualified withdrawal later in this guide.

Consolidation. Consider consolidating any previous retirement plan accounts to help you see your overall retirement picture more clearly. For more information and the necessary forms, contact our Consolidation hotline at, 1-800-328-6608. Keep in mind that fees may apply when closing and consolidating accounts.



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Frequently asked questions about your Plan.

Here are answers to questions you may have about the key features, benefits, and rules of your Plan.

ENROLLMENT AND ACCOUNT SETUP

When can I enroll in the Plan?

You are able to enroll in the Plan at any time. We encourage you to take an active role in the Plan and choose a contribution rate and investment options that are appropriate for you.

How do I enroll in the Plan?

If you wish to enroll in the Plan within your first 45 days of hire, please log on to Fidelity NetBenefits® at www.netbenefits.com/lghealth or call the Fidelity Retirement Service Center at 1-800-343-0860 to enroll in the Plan.

What happens if I do not enroll in the Plan?

If you have not enrolled in the Plan within 45 days from your date of hire, you will be automatically enrolled in the Plan at a contribution rate of 6% of your pretax eligible earnings.

Unless you elect otherwise, your contributions will be directed to a Fidelity Freedom® Fund that has a target retirement date closest to the year in which you might retire based on your current age and assuming a retirement age of 65, as directed by Lancaster General Health. Please see the chart located in the *Investment Options* section for more information regarding the Fidelity Freedom® Funds.

If you do not wish to contribute to the Plan, you must change your contribution rate to 0% within the first 45 days of your employment. You may stop, reinstate, or change your contribution rate at any time by logging on to NetBenefits® at www.netbenefits.com/lghealth, or by calling Fidelity at 1-800-343-0860.

When is my enrollment effective?

Your enrollment becomes effective as soon as you elect your contribution rate or 45 days after your date of hire, whichever comes first.

How much can I contribute on a pretax and/or Roth basis?

You may make pretax and/or Roth contributions up to 75% of your eligible compensation (in 1% increments), subject to annual IRS and Plan limits. Please note that your total combined (pretax and Roth) employee contribution may not exceed 75% of your eligible compensation.

The Internal Revenue Code provides that the combined annual limit for total Plan contributions is 100% of your W-2 compensation or \$53,000, whichever is less. This limit includes both employee and employer contributions.

You can change your contribution amount and how your contributions (pretax and/or Roth) are invested at any time.

Which type of contribution option is right for me, pretax and/or Roth?

To help you determine which contribution type is right for you, review the *Roth Contributions* section of this guide.

What are the IRS employee contribution limits?

If you are under age 50, the IRS contribution limit for 2015 is \$18,000. If you will be at least age 50 during the year, your Plan allows you to contribute up to \$24,000 in 2015.

Does Lancaster General Health contribute to my account?

Once you have completed six months of service and reached age 21, Lancaster General Health will make a **nonmatching contribution** (basic contribution) in the amount of 2% of compensation each pay period. This contribution is made on your behalf regardless of your participation in the Lancaster General Health Retirement Income Account. This contribution is discretionary for Affilia Home Health employees.

You will also receive an **employer matching contribution** of 50% of the first 6% of all compensation you contribute to the Plan each pay period during the calendar year.

How do I designate my beneficiary?

Fidelity's Online Beneficiaries Service, available through Fidelity NetBenefits®, offers a straightforward, convenient process that takes just minutes. Simply log on to Fidelity NetBenefits® and click *Beneficiaries* in the *About You* section of *Your Profile*. If you do not have access to the Internet, or if you prefer to complete your beneficiary information by paper form, please contact Fidelity at 1-800-343-0860.

Be sure to update your beneficiary information whenever you experience a life-changing event such as a marriage, a divorce, the birth of a child, or a death in the family.

Is there a Plan administration fee?

Your Plan includes an annual plan administration fee of \$25. This fee is assessed annually and paid quarterly. However, Lancaster General Health will pay \$15 of that fee. The remaining \$10 (\$2.50 each quarter) will be deducted directly from your Plan account. If you are no longer an active employee at Lancaster General Health, the entire \$25 fee will be deducted from your Plan account (\$6.25 each quarter).

Can I move money from another retirement plan into my Lancaster General Health Retirement Income Account?

You are permitted to roll over eligible pretax or after-tax contributions from a 401(a), 401(k), 403(b), or governmental 457(b) plan account. You also may roll over eligible contributions from a previous Roth 403(b) account.

Contact our Consolidation Hotline at 1-800-328-6608 for help completing your transfer/rollover forms. You should consult your tax advisor and carefully consider the impact of making a rollover contribution to the Lancaster General Health Retirement Income Account, because it could affect your eligibility for future special tax treatments.

How do I access my account?

You can access your account online through Fidelity NetBenefits® at www.netbenefits.com/lghealth, by calling the Fidelity Retirement Service Center at 1-800-343-0860 to speak with a representative, or by using the automated voice response system virtually 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

INVESTMENT OPTIONS

What are my investment options?

To help you meet your investment goals, the Plan offers you a range of options. You can select a mix of investment options that best suits your goals, time horizon, and risk tolerance. The various investment options available through the Plan include conservative, moderately conservative, and aggressive funds. A complete description of the Plan's investment options and their performance, as well as planning tools to help you choose an appropriate mix, are available online at Fidelity NetBenefits®.

The Plan also offers the Fidelity Freedom® Funds, which provide a blend of stocks, bonds, and short-term investments within a single fund. Each Freedom Fund's asset allocation is based on the number of years until the fund's target retirement date. The Freedom Funds are designed for investors who want a simple approach to investing for retirement. They are lifecycle funds designed for investors expecting to retire around the year indicated in each fund's name. The investment risk of each lifecycle fund changes over time as its asset allocation changes. These funds are subject to the volatility of the financial markets, including that of equity and fixed income investments in the U.S. and abroad, and may be subject to risks associated with investing in high-yield, small-cap, and foreign securities. Money invested is not guaranteed at any time, including at or after the funds' target dates.

Your Plan also offers a fixed annuity. An annuity is a contract issued by an insurance company and purchased by a consumer for long-term investing. There are various fees and expenses associated with annuities, and in certain situations, withdrawal penalties may be applicable. An annuity is not a mutual fund.

A fixed annuity lets you lock in a guaranteed rate of interest for a specific period—one year. As each "guarantee rate period" comes to a close, the insurance company sets a new interest rate for the upcoming period. Interest rates and time periods vary depending on the annuity contract. Guarantees are subject to the claimspaying ability of the issuing insurance company.

How do I obtain additional investment option and account information?

Lancaster General Health has appointed Fidelity to provide additional information regarding the investment options available through the Plan.

You may request a statement of your account by calling 1-800-343-0860, or you may review it online at www.netbenefits.com/lghealth.

What are my rights with respect to mutual fund pass-through voting?

As a Plan participant, you have the ability to exercise voting, tender, and other similar rights for mutual funds in which you are invested through the Plan. Materials related to the exercise of these rights will be sent at the time of any proxy meeting, tender offer, or rights relating to the particular mutual funds held in your account.

ROTH CONTRIBUTIONS

What is the Roth contribution option?

The Lancaster General Health Retirement Income Account allows you to make after-tax contributions from your paycheck and take any associated earnings completely tax-free at retirement—as long as the distribution is qualified. A qualified distribution must be taken at least five tax years after your first Roth 403(b) contribution and after you have either attained age 59½ or have died. Distributions to your named beneficiaries are also tax free.

Through automatic payroll deduction, you can contribute between 1% and 75% of your eligible pay as designated Roth contributions, up to the annual IRS limits. All employees are eligible to make Roth 403(b) contributions, regardless of income level.

How does a Roth 403(b) contribution option work?

You choose a contribution rate that you wish to contribute to the Roth 403(b), just as you would for your pretax contribution. The contribution is based on your eligible compensation, not on your net pay. For example, if your total annual eligible compensation is \$40,000 per year, and you elect a 6% contribution rate, then \$2,400 per year would go into your Roth 403(b).

Unlike your traditional 403(b) pretax contribution, with a Roth 403(b) contribution you pay the taxes now on the contributions you make—but later, if you meet certain criteria, all of your earnings are tax free.

Example: Sally earns \$40,000 and has elected to put 6% toward her Roth 403(b) contributions and 6% toward her 403(b) pretax contributions on a monthly basis.

	Roth Contribution	Pretax Contribution*
Sally's monthly contribution into each account	\$200	\$200
Sally's reduction in take-home pay	\$200	\$150

*This hypothetical example is based solely on an assumed federal income tax rate of 25%. No other payroll deductions are taken into account. Your own results will be based on your individual tax situation.

Your combined Roth and pretax 403(b) contributions cannot exceed the IRS limits for the year.

DISTRIBUTIONS

When am I vested?

You are immediately 100% vested in your own contributions to the Lancaster General Health Retirement Income Account, as well as in any earnings on these contributions. Contributions made by Lancaster General Health, and any earnings, vest according to the following schedule:

Years of service	Vested percentage
1	0%
2	0%
3	100%

For the purposes of vesting, you earn one year of vesting service for each calendar year in which you complete 1,000 or more hours of service.

Can I take a loan from my account?

Although your Plan account is intended for the future, you may borrow from your account for any reason. You may have only one loan outstanding at a time. The cost to initiate a loan is \$50, and there is a quarterly maintenance fee of \$6.25. The initiation and maintenance fees will be deducted directly from your individual Plan account. Generally, you may borrow the lesser of 50% of your vested account balance or \$50,000. Any outstanding loan balances over the previous 12 months may reduce the amount you have available to borrow. The minimum

amount you may borrow is \$1,000. You then pay the money, plus interest, back into your account through after-tax payroll deductions. If you fail to repay your loan (based on the original terms of the loan), it will be considered in "default" and treated as a distribution, making it subject to income tax and possibly to a 10% early withdrawal penalty. Defaulted loans may also impact your eligibility to request future loans. Be sure you understand the Plan guidelines before you initiate a loan from your Plan account.

Can I make withdrawals from my account?

Withdrawals from the Plan are generally permitted when you terminate your employment, retire, reach age 59½, or have a severe financial hardship as defined by your Plan. Keep in mind that withdrawals are subject to income taxes and possibly to early withdrawal penalties.

The taxable portion of your withdrawal that is eligible for rollover into an individual retirement account (IRA) or another employer's retirement plan is subject to a 20% mandatory federal income tax withholding, unless it is rolled directly over to an IRA or another employer plan. (You may owe more or less when you file your income taxes.) If you are under age 59½, the taxable portion of your withdrawal is also subject to a 10% early withdrawal penalty, unless you qualify for an exception to this rule. The Plan document and current tax laws and regulations will govern. Be sure you understand the tax consequences and your Plan's rules for distributions before you initiate a distribution. You may want to consult your tax advisor about your situation.

Fund Objective: To provide a high quality investment option, earnings stability and liquidity, while offering a guarantee of principal and interest.

Fund Strategy: The Principal Fixed Account is backed by the general account of Principal Life. This diversified general account portfolio consists of public and private securities, commercial and residential mortgages and U.S. agency securities. Competitive interest rates are set by The Principal annually and the rate remains fixed for the next 12 months it is in effect. Interest rates are subject to market risk. Return will vary.

Fund Risk: The fund is backed by a diversified portfolio of fixed-income assets held in the general account of the issuer. Guarantees are subject to the claims paying ability of the issuer. Fund Strategy: The fund normally invests at least 65% of its total assets in a diversified portfolio of Fixed Income Instruments of varying maturities, which may be represented by forwards or derivatives such as options, futures contracts, or swap agreements. It invests primarily in investment-grade debt securities, but may invest up to 10% of its total assets in high yield securities ("junk bonds") rated B or higher by Moody's, or equivalently rated by S&P or Fitch, or, if unrated, determined by PIMCO to be of comparable quality.

Fund Risk: In general the bond market is volatile, and fixed income securities carry interest rate risk. (As interest rates rise, bond prices usually fall, and vice versa.
